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2016 Program Detail

PURPOSE

- 1. Funding of the Pickering Auxiliary Rescue Association (PARA) to facilitate the operations of its marine assets.
- 1. PARA is a registered charity "dedicated to helping the person in the water" through the Marine Search and Rescue (SAR) Mandate

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

- 2. Marine SAR Mandate
 - a. Provide marine search and rescue capability in the Canadian waters of Lake Ontario adjacent to the Region of Durham.
 - b. This mandate supports the national search and rescue objectives and provides the necessary sector coverage for the Canadian Coast Guard (CCG).
 - c. Assist in marine SAR, in humanitarian and civil incidents as directed by the Joint Rescue Coordination Centre (JRCC)
 - d. Collaborate as part of the Canadian Coast Guard Auxiliary (CCGA) with other local CCGA units.
 - e. Provide Durham Region additional marine SAR asset to support local Fire Services and Durham Regional Police Services (DRPS).
- 3. PARA Capability
 - a. Operate and maintain the dedicated rescue vessel PARU based out of Frenchman's Bay, Pickering.
 - b. Maintain and improve the rescue vessel SAR capability and operational safety.
 - c. Provide continuing training to develop and maintain volunteer competency.
 - d. Educate the public in support of the SAR Prevention objectives of the CCG and CCGA.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM RESOURCES

- 1. 49 PARA volunteers are currently active with the organization.
- 2. The membership expectation is upwards of 70 patrol hours, 10 Community hours, and upwards of 40 training hours for a minimum total 120 hour commitment.
- 3. Members are spread across 6 crews with patrols scheduled from May long weekend through to the end of the Thanksgiving weekend.
- 4. Emergency, 7x24 on call list of PARA volunteers for JRCC ordered missions during the period from late April till mid November.

PERFORMANCE MEASURES

- 1. SAFETY: Target Injury rate: Zero. In 2016, there were no injuries.
- 2. TOTAL HOURS: 6,000 hours

a. Average hours per person: 122 hours

b. Patrol hours: 3,100 hours

c. Persons more than 200 hours: 11



3. SAR MISSIONS: 11 Taskings with 2 stand downs

- a. Total Person Hours: 211 hours of which 130 are off patrol hours.
- b. Average Response overall is 14 mins for all taskings. 2 mins for the 6 on duty taskings versus 29 mins for the 5 off duty taskings.
- c. Average Duration: 3.2 hours
- d. Total mission hours: 38.1 hours
- e. 10 persons assisted
- f. Approximately \$100,000 in assets assisted.
- 4. COMMUNITY PROGRAM: 500 Hours
 - a. Participated in Whitby Harbour days, local yacht clubs events, dragon boat events, community improvements events such as Take Pride in Pickering.
 - b. PARA also hosted the annual fundraiser at Herongate Dinner Theatre to support funds for capital purchases.

5. TRAINING PROGRAM: 1800 Hours

- a. Objective: maintain and upgrade boating skills and knowledge through classroom and on-water training activities.
 - i. On water activities include Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) training for vessel evolutions, practical evaluation of CCGA Phase 1 and 2 materials, scenario based training, cooperative exercises with other local and national SAR assets. Crew assessments and requalification of each member are required to be completed once every 5 years.
 - ii. Classroom activities include first aid, marine radio (Canadian Power Squadron), basic SAR concepts, vessel operations, weather and navigation
 - iii. Other training has included fire safety training conducted by Ontario Power Generation (OPG) and sea survival training at local pool facilities.
- b. CCGA Central & Artic implemented a new training program as mentioned in the 2015 report. 16 of 49 members are undergoing or have completed the training.
- c. Over the past 2 years, PARA implemented succession planning for Coxswains. In the that time period, there have been 3 new coxswain appointments (50%) due to attrition.

6. ADMINISTATIVE IMPROVEMENTS: 440 Hours

- a. Implementation of a new online calendar, time tracking and administration site.
- b. Improved member relations and communications.

7. FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS:

- a. PARU was relocated, from Frenchman's Bay Yacht Club, to the eastern side of Frenchman's Bay in order to provide an improved response time when exiting the harbour.
- b. Storage facilities were installed on this eastern site. Excess equipment was removed from PARU to ensure minimize weight and storage onboard resulting in improved housekeeping and safety onboard the vessel.



- 8. VESSEL AVAILABILITY, MAINTENANCE & IMPROVEMENTS: 140 Hours
 - a. Vessel Availability: 97.9% versus expectation of 95%.
 - b. Budget expenses 52% spent of annual budget to reporting date.
 - c. Maintenance activities this year included communication equipment replacements, weather station installation and other minor maintenance. A major outdrive overhaul is scheduled for late 2016 and other vessel improvements in early 2017.
 - d. Communications with local fire services and DRPS via dedicated Harris radio system. This proved to a valuable asset during SAR missions on Lake Ontario where there is limited cell service available.

FUTURE CONSIDERATIONS

- 1. Cost recovery for use of the Durham Region radio system is estimated at \$2K per annum. PARA is requesting the annual budget be increased by \$2K to offset this cost transfer back to the Region.
- 2. PARA is looking to raise capital funds for an additional vessel in 3-4 years and subsequently a long-term replacement vessel for the current SAR asset (PARU). This may have an impact on future operational funding requests.
